

The Privacy Act of 1974 (P.L. 93-579) is a Federal law designed to protect you from unauthorized use and exchange of personal information by Federal agencies. Any information that a Federal agency has about you, such as Social Security data, your military service records, or census information may not, with a few exceptions, be given to another agency or to a Member of Congress without your written permission.

Investigation of the matter about which you have contacted me may require that I ask one or more Federal agencies for information which is considered confidential under the Privacy Act. **To better assist you, I ask that you sign the consent form below.**
